Meaning: To travel around in a big circle, especially by ship or plane.

Origin: The word 'circumnavigate' is derived from 'circum' meaning 'around' and 'navigare' meaning 'to navigate'. It was first used in the era when sailors were trying to find new lands they didn't know about, and so the 'around' in question was the trip around the entire earth. 'Circumnavigate' is also used to describe something that's too difficult to go through, such as a massive crowd at a festival.

Usage: 1. He was the first person to complete the circumnavigation of Australia.

2. He gave up his circumnavigation attempt after his ship hit an iceberg.

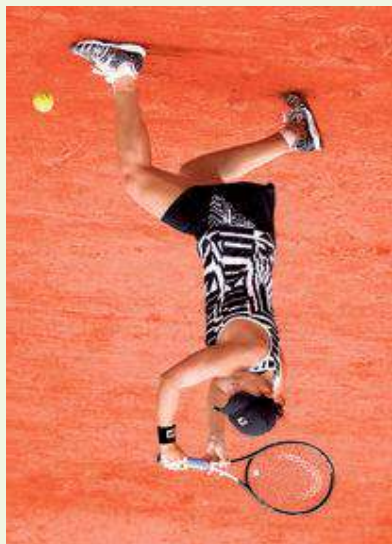

1. At more than 42 million acres, it is the world's largest tropical wetland, and one of the most pristine.
2. It is located mostly in the Brazilian state of Mato Grosso do Sul, and the countries of Bolivia and Paraguay.
3. It supports some iconic wildlife ranging from crocodiles and jaguars to the hyacinth macaw.
4. The name of this wetland comes from the Portuguese 'pantano' meaning bog, swamp, marsh or quagmire.
5. Around 80 per cent of the floodplains get submerged during the rainy season, and nurture a biologically diverse collection of aquatic plants.
6. This South American wonder was inscribed as a UNESCO World Heritage Site in the year 2000. Part of the wetland is a national park.
